Mixed Media Paper Collage Banner

Finished size: 9" x 12"

Materials

- Fabric Elements[™] Banner
- Fabric Elements[™] Printed Tissue
- The Crafter's Workshop stencils by Rebekah Meier, TCW527 Word Association, TCW528 Daily Buzz
- The Warm Company[®] Steam-A-Seam II[™] double sided fusible web 9" x 12" sheets
- White, ivory and black craft paint
- Jacquard Dye-na-Flow[™] free flowing acrylic paint, various colors
- Lumiere Metallic Gold
- 1" round and flat brushes
- Stencil brush or cosmetic sponge
- Black archival ink
- Stamps wth script and dot images

- Sewing machine
- Black sewing machine thread
- iron and pad
- Scissors
- Parchment paper

Instructions

- Remove film from one side of Steam-A-Seam II. Press one 9" x 12" piece of Fabric Elements printed tissue onto the sticky side. Press paper side of fusible web with hot iron.
- Starting at one corner, remove remaining film and press sticky side of fusible web onto Banner. Cover Banner with parchment paper. Press parchment paper with iron set to cotton setting.
- 3. Paint one coat of diluted ivory craft paint onto paper side of Banner. Use a one part water to two parts acrylic ratio. Let dry.
- 4. Using a flat brush, apply diluted (one part water to two parts acrylic) Dye-na-Flow thin bodied free flowing acrylics onto paper side of banner. Dry slightly be-tween each color application. Load round brush with

diluted thin bodied acrylic and drip colors onto Banner. Let dry.

- 5. Using a cosmetic sponge, apply metallic gold onto random areas of Banner.
- 6. Load script stamp with black archival ink. Stamp design onto random areas of Banner.
- Place stencil onto Banner. Load stencil brush with black craft paint, remove excess onto paper towel. Stencil design onto Banner.
- 8. Repeat steps adding color or brushing with white to create a contrast and collage painted effect.
- 9. Step back and consider design, add more paint where desired, to complete Banner.
- 10. Apply fusible web to fuse fabric strips onto Banner.
- 11. Using black thread, machine zig-zag and straight stitch lines onto fabric strips, body of Banner, around and perimeter.
